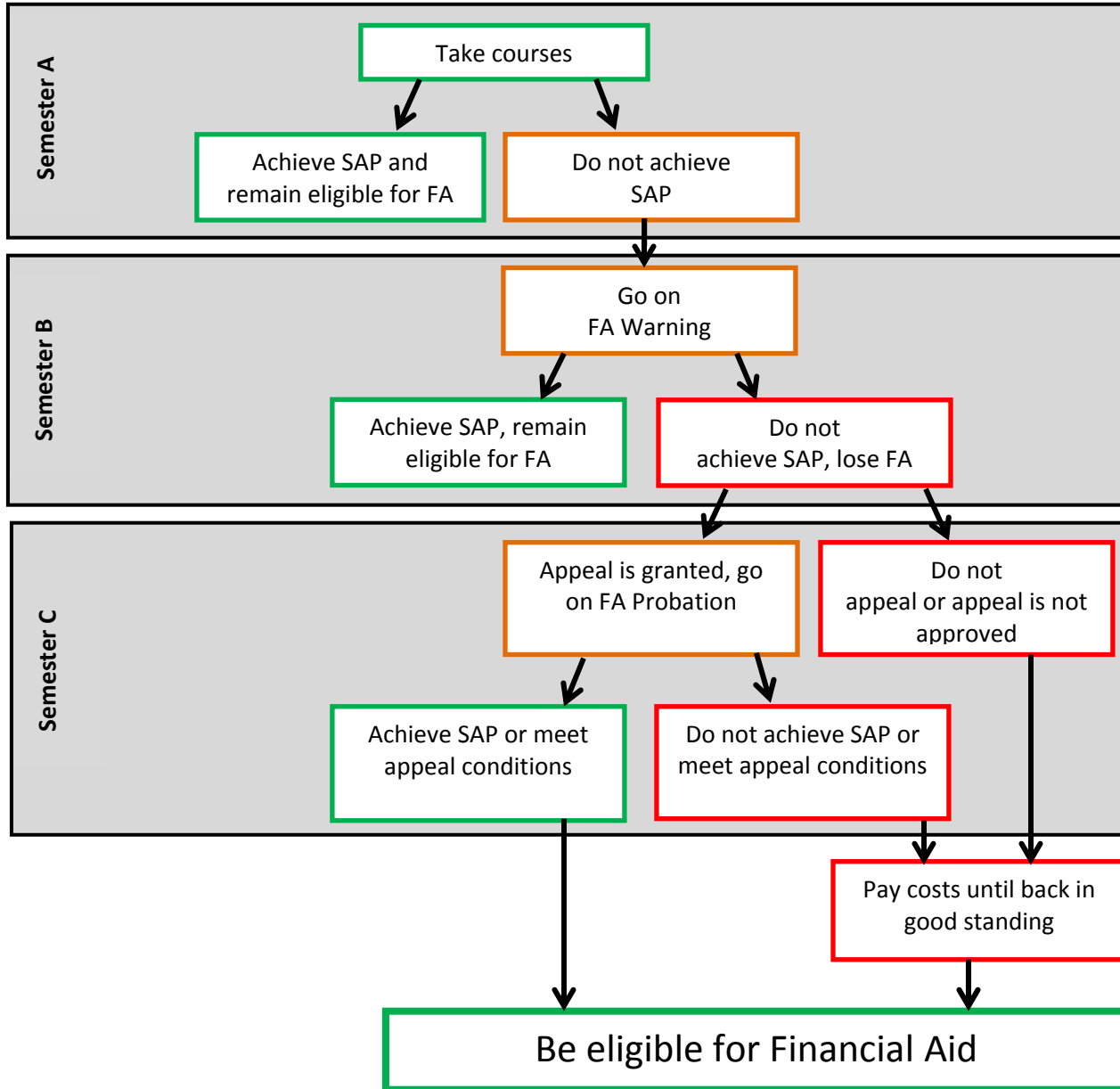


FINISH WHAT YOU START!

Financial Aid offers millions of students the opportunity to go to college, but as a recipient of Financial Aid (FA), you have the responsibility to be successful in their courses. New Financial Aid regulations governing satisfactory academic progress require students and advisors to understand what it takes to be successful and remain eligible for Financial Aid.



What is Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)?

To “achieve SAP”, or make the academic progress necessary to remain eligible for Financial Aid, you must:

1. Maintain the minimum GPA required by your attempted hours:

Attempted Hours	Minimum GPA
1-10	1.00
11-20	1.5
21-30	1.75
31+	2.00

2. Complete at least 66% of the credits you attempt with the review process beginning after 11 credits are attempted
3. Complete your degree in at least 150% of the hours required for that degree

Important Notes:

Repeats: Financial Aid will only pay for you to repeat a class once if you are required to repeat it for your program. Financial Aid will not pay for you to repeat a course for a third time for any reason.

Withdrawals: Withdrawals are used to calculate both items #2 and #3 above.
