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### **Special Advising Notes:**

#### Selective Admissions:

Entrance to the RN Clinical coursework is selective and determined by meeting the minimum nursing prerequisites and clinical application point system. Students must meet the minimum prerequisites as outlined in section 1a & 1b before submitting a clinical nursing petition.

Clinical petitions are due December 30 each year. Petitions can be obtained and submitted in the Welcome Center B001. If your petition is submitted after the posted deadline, the petition will not be accepted. The general education courses listed in **SECTION 2** of this worksheet will contribute to your petition points. Please refer to the **RN Clinical Application Point Worksheet**.

Due to the selectivity of this program, the importance of course sequencing and the priority deadlines, it is **strongly encouraged** that you meet **regularly** with your advisor located in B209.

<u>Important Note:</u> Section 4 of this check sheet is **NOT REQUIRED** for RN Students. However, students do have the available option of completing this additional degree option. Please see an advisor for more details.
